WHAT are the top companies
Malaysians want to work for?
According to the JobStreet.com Top
10 Companies 2016 survey, oil and
gas companies remain highly
sought-after by employees, securing
the two top spots for yet another
year.

Coming in first for two years consecutively is Malaysia's state oil firm, Petronas. Second in line is Anglo-Dutch multinational, Shell while the third place is held by tech heavyweight, Google.

Sime Darby and Maybank are fourth and fifth respectively, and the others which made the Top 10 list in order of ranking are Air Asia, Nestle, Intel, Tenaga Nasional Berhad and Public Bank.

Petronas group human resource management senior vice president Datuk Raiha Azni Abd Rahman said: "As a global energy player, Petronas believes in growing and developing our people as a critical priority of business in order to successfully operate in today's challenging business environment.
"As such we strive to cultivate a

The survey also found that across all position levels, "Benefits and Incentives" surfaced as the main reason employees want to work with top companies. With monetary gains being a key
