Coach Harfizi warns MBPJ not to be complacent in title run-in

KUALA LUMPUR: Petaling Jaya City Council (MBPJ) are just four matches from taking the Malaysian Junior Hockey League's Division One title.

They are two points ahead of nearest rivals SSTMI Thunderbolt and could consolidate their position today when they play SMKDBL Johor Juniors.

MBPJ have 15 points while defending champions SSTMI Thunderbolt have 13. Third-placed BJSS Thunderbolt have 12 and are still in the title mix.

After today's match, MBPJ's other fixtures are against Politeknik Malaysia (May 3), AHP-MSP Thunderbolt (May 5) and BJSS Thunderbolt (May 7).

MBPJ coach Mohamed Harfizi Baharom has warned his side not to be complacent in the title run-in.

"All are big games and we cannot afford to drop points.

"The title is within our grasp. We have to stay focused," said Harfizi.

The one thing that pleased Harfizi is the team's ability to score goals. They have scored 20 goals in five matches with 11 players on the scorers' list. Sixteen-year-old Mohamad Syabil Aizam Mohamad Noor is the team's top scorer with four goals.

"We need to keep firing away and don't let the chances go to waste.

"It's good that we don't depend on just a handful of players to get the goals," said Harfizi.

He also warned his players not to underestimate fourth-placed Johor Juniors.

"We cannot take Johor Juniors for granted although they have lost twice. They are desperate for points. We need to be patient to overcome them," he said.

In today's other matches, SSTMI and BJSS Thunderbolt are also expected to win to keep pace with leaders MBPJ.

SSTMI entertain fifth-placed Universiti Kuala Lumpur (UniKL) while BJSS Thunderbolt face eighth-placed Olak Nurinsafi.
